“I taught myself how to play the drums with the drumsticks in my mouth!” said Rosario. “I also have my own graphic design company and I love to skateboard! Doing comedy is also one of the things I enjoy and it makes people laugh! My comedy is just my way of showing people they don’t have to be all serious about people with disabilities, we laugh too! We know how to have fun!” Doctors said I wouldn’t live past the age of XXX or do any of the things I’m doing now! I’ve proven them all wrong!”

Rosario will be performing his adult-related humor at The Comedy Room at Portofino’s in Wyandotte this Saturday Night.

Rosario’s motto is “livin’ on the edge!” And that he does with a vengeance! Rosario, who receives supports and services from Community Living Services will be holding a fundraiser.
